

Scott Guzzo Scholarship for Disability-Related Studies

About the Scott Guzzo Scholarship for Disability-Related Studies

Bob and Paula Guzzo created this scholarship to honor their son, Scott Guzzo, and to assist an EVSC senior to further his/her education at a postsecondary institution.

This scholarship is intended to support the post-secondary education of EVSC students who will pursue a degree in a field such as therapy (e.g., occupational, physical or speech), special education, disability studies, disability law, disability medicine, rehabilitation engineering, assistive technology, etc. which are related to physical disabilities.

The scholarship is named for Scott Guzzo, who completed his secondary education at Central High School in 2004. In the early 1990's, Scott was EVSC's first student with multiple disabilities to be educated in an inclusive school setting. Scott's successful inclusion in EVSC led to him being President Clinton's guest at the White House for the signing of the 1997 Reauthorization of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA).

The EVSC Foundation, a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit corporation, is dedicated to maximizing individual, organizational, and business support on behalf of Evansville Vanderburgh School Corporation to ensure student success.

Eligibility

Applicants must:

- Be a graduating EVSC senior.
- Have a minimum cumulative high school grade point average of 2.8 on a 4.0 scale (or an equivalent).
- Plan to enroll full-time** no later than the upcoming fall semester at an accredited public college, university, or community college.
- Plan to pursue a degree that leads to a career which will support people with physical disabilities as described in the "About" section of this document.
- Maintain a 2.5 cumulative GPA on 4.0 scale, barring compelling non-academic reasons, while attending the selected college or university.

***Full-time study is defined as full-time enrollment for the entire academic year.*

Award Criteria

Selection of recipients will be based on solid academic performance and participation within student organizations.

Financial need is a consideration.

The selection process of the recipient will be by a scholarship committee with representatives from EVSC, one or both of the donors, and others as deemed necessary by EVSC or the donors. Awards are based on a competitive process which will consider academic achievement, extracurricular activities, personal aspirations, and educational goals.

Awards are for undergraduate study only and are awarded without regard to race, color, creed, religion, sexual orientation, age, gender or disability.

Award Amount

The scholarship amount is \$500 annually, renewable for a total of \$2,000 over four years. The scholarship recipient will be notified in May by his/her Counselor. \$500 will be paid to the student's college at the start of the fall semester.

The student's eligibility criteria will be reviewed annually to ensure the student is still pursuing the intended degree and has maintained the required GPA.

Submitting the Application Packet:

Carefully review your application before submission. All pages must be submitted in a manila envelope in the following order:

1. Completed Application Form
2. Completed Essay Response
3. Official grade transcript (most recent)
4. Copy of applicant's Student Aid Report (SAR) Summary

Once the application is submitted, no further additions or changes may be made. Please submit applications before Friday, March 26, 2021 to the EVSC Foundation at 951 Walnut St., Evansville, IN 47713 or info@evscfoundation.org

Payment of Scholarships

The Scholarship check will be made payable to the recipient's college or university and mailed to the college or university upon receipt of the necessary paperwork that must be filed with the EVSC Foundation. This paperwork will be provided to the recipient at the Class Day assembly when the scholarship is announced.

To the Applicant

By completing the information required in this application, you will demonstrate your eligibility to receive funds distributed by the EVSC Foundation.

Applicants are solely responsible for submitting all information necessary to the application process. Applications are evaluated on the information supplied; therefore, answer all questions as thoroughly as possible.

All information submitted is considered confidential and is reviewed only by the scholarship committee.
